

2018 Stewardship Campaign Announcement

On September 24th FPC will kick-off the 2018 Stewardship Campaign with a two-week (three Sundays) stewardship series called "LIVE GENEROUSLY". We will be learning how to become more generous givers and faithful stewards as we focus each week on a Live Generously component: A "Minute for Stewardship", sermons,



and scripture readings will focus on stewardship. Our children and youth will be learning about the biblical concept of living a generous life through Bible studies, object lessons, and demonstrations. In Sunday School and on Wednesday evenings children will learn what "LIVE GENEROUSLY" means and how they can live out this concept.

Later in September, you will receive a stewardship letter of invitation with a pledge card. On the reverse side of the letter will be an ESTIMATED 2018 Operating Budget. We hope this estimate of income and expenses will help you understand how our congregation can best use the contributions we receive to live out the mission and ministry to which we are called.

After prayerful consideration, please fill out the pledge card and bring it to worship on Commitment Sunday, October 8th. You will be invited to bring your completed pledge card to the front of the Sanctuary for deposit in the Joash Chest, a visible symbol of people coming together to offer our gifts to God.

Together we will learn more about what it means to more fully follow and rely on Jesus while loving and serving our community, and how we can experience more deeply the joy of a simple and abundant life---to "LIVE GENEROUSLY".

Yippee! It's September and that means that fall programming is starting up. I get excited just thinking about it and I hope you do too! Our Wednesday evening Children's program (hereafter called WOW) will kick off on Wednesday,

September 6th from 5:30 to 7:00 PM with a Pizza Party Preview. We'll have pizza, run through where we will be and what we will be doing this year at WOW and play lots of games (and yes, that includes GaGa Ball). I invite all our kindergarteners through 6th graders to join me for the evening. Parents of new students and visitors are invited to join us as well. I want to thank Cindy Reilly for helping me put on this fun evening.

The WOW schedule and menu for the year is now available. It's on the Christian Education table in the Library. Also on that table is a 2017/18 Registration form for Children and Youth programming at First Presbyterian. If you have a child or youth ages 3 through 12th grade and plan to have your child involved in Sunday School, WOW or Illuminate, please fill out a registration form. We are thankful that we are able to hold the cost of WOW and Illuminate dinners to \$50 per child for the entire year. If cost is an issue though, please remember that scholarships are available for the asking. We are blessed to have Mike Tabler heading up the WOW Cooking Team again this year.

WOW meets for dinner at 5:30 PM and then between 6:00 and 7:00 PM, students move

between Faith Education and Music Rotations in two different groups (K- 2 and 3 – 6). Our younger group will be focusing on the 10 Commandments in Faith Education first semester. They will have a brief lesson and do a craft or play a game to reinforce each particular commandment. Ages 3 through 6 will explore World Religions. Our intent is to promote knowledge of and respect for other peoples and faiths of the world.
