#### An "aha" Moment

"After they had listened to Herod, they went on their way, and the star they had seen when it rose went ahead of them until it stopped over the place where the child was. When they saw the star, they were overjoyed. On coming to the house, they saw the child with his mother Mary, and they bowed down and worshiped him. Then they opened their treasures and presented him with gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to go back to Herod, they returned to their country by another route." (Mt 2:9-12)

This January 6th, like every other January 6th before, we celebrate the Epiphany. By tradition, this is the day that the wise men arrive at the manger to pay homage to the newborn Messiah. It is the revelation of Christ to the Gentiles as foretold by prophecy. And that is certainly good news to us Gentiles! But the whole idea of Epiphany carries a much deeper meaning than that.

Epiphany, which comes from the Greek word epiphaneia, means "an appearance" or "a revealing." Since Jesus' first followers were Jewish, the revelation of Christ to the non-Jewish magi reminds us that Jesus came to save the whole world. Symbols of Epiphany include light, a star, a crown (or three crowns) and a globe or stylized portrayal of the world. The color of Epiphany is green to symbolize life, growth, hope and eternity. On the church calendar, the season of Epiphany lasts until Ash Wednesday.

Epiphany can also mean a sudden, brilliant realization, like the light bulb over your head moment when you finally put two and two together or when you have a brilliant inspiration. Think of Isaac Newton's epiphany when he suddenly realized that an apple falling to the earth rather than flying off into space was caused by the invisible force of gravity.

My hope and prayer for you and me as we enter into this season of Epiphany is that we will have our own personal "aha" moment. That we will discover some new insight about the God that we worship. That we will finally "see" our God in a new and exciting way. That God working in the world and in our lives will be revealed to us by people and through events that we might never have considered before. Like some foreign wise men bringing news to Herod or shepherds bringing the news to their friends.

Our God has never been one to remain hidden from us for long. It just isn't always obvious where God may be or in which ways God may be working in our lives. But would you expect anything less from the God who chose to show strength in weakness, glory by emptying Himself of all power and wisdom in becoming a fool in the eyes of this world?

So where and through whom will the God of the Epiphany be revealed to you?

## PER CAPITA – PER PERSON

Per capita is a Latin term that translates into "by head," basically meaning "average per person."

Per capita is important to being Presbyterian! It is the way Presbyterians mutually share governance expenses to make mission and programs possible. It is how Presbyterians discern God's call in their lives. It is how Presbyterians participate in the life of the wider church by serving on General Assembly committees and commissions. It is how Presbyterians participate in the life of the Church universal as we commit ourselves to work and live in fellowship with "all persons in every nation."

The required total per capita amount due from each congregation is a combined request from the Presbytery of Missouri River Valley, Synod of Lakes and Prairies, and the General Assembly - of which each congregation is a part. We owe \$38.33 for each person (Per Capita) on the active rolls of our church. In 2018, the apportionment due for our church will be \$11,537.33.

There will be a special blue per capita envelope on the name tag table. Please use that envelope to pay your Per Capita and write your envelope # on your check, If you do not have the envelope please write Per Capita in the memo portion of your check. To go above and beyond what you do for your own per capita, please consider adding an additional amount for our confirmands or shut-ins.

Our church must pay our total per capita amount by February 15, 2018.

#### 2018 Stewardship Campaign Updated Results as of December 18, 2017

We have now received 91 pledges totaling \$258,013. This excellent result is already \$8,000 more than the \$250,283 pledged for 2017, but still slightly short of our \$262,500 goal.

To those of you who have already turned in your 2018 pledge, we sincerely thank you. If you wish to pre-pay any part of your 2018 pledge---be sure to turn in your contribution NLT December 31, 2017.

#### DEBT PAY-OFF CAMPAIGN UPDATE As of December 18, 2017

First Presbyterian Church's outstanding building loan balance now stands at \$256.717. In July 2013, our outstanding debt stood at \$750,000. The monthly loan payment is \$6,715.

So far, the October 2016 Debt Pay-Off Campaign has received 36 pledges totaling \$87,852. Contributions to date are over \$103,051 which reflects \$61,720 in pledged contributions and \$41,331 in non-pledged contributions. Many FPC members are contributing but had elected not to pledge.

The DEBT PAY-OFF FUND currently contains \$35.910 With continuing known contributions of \$3,500 to \$4,000 per month, we will be able to make loan payments for all of 2018 without impacting the 2018 Operating Budget---but not much beyond. If you have not pledged, or you are not contributing to the Debt Pay -Off Campaign, we prayerfully ask you to do so. Wouldn't it be marvelous if we could have the loan fully paid off early in 2019? Including last year's loan REFI this would save the church about \$30,000 in interest expense, plus free up money every year for future growth and mission work. Please use the RED pledge card located on the name tag table. Please continue to use the PINK envelopes for your contributions.


\$640 to buy whatever was needed. At the event they were served hot cocoa and sweet treats along with a Village Inn pie to take home.


