Sea La Luz

The Menaul School in Albuquerque is one of the college-prep High Schools that our denomination has supported since the 1800's. In fact, part of the money we collect in our Christmas Joy offering helps fund this and many other schools. "Sea La Luz" has been their motto for many years now. "Sea La Luz," Spanish for "Be The Light." It is a reminder to the students that they are being prepared to take their places in society to point to the light of the Gospel that Christ has entrusted to them.

Many years ago, before railroad crossing gates, flagmen were employed to warn people that a train was coming. They used a flag by day and a lantern by night. One very dark night, at a dangerous crossing there was a terrible accident. A lawsuit followed and during the trial, the flagman was called to the witness stand. The prosecuting attorney asked him, "On the night of the accident, when you saw the car approaching, did you wave your lantern?" Yes, I waved the lantern," he answered. The attorney asked a second time. "Did you wave the lantern?" Again, the flagman relied, "Yes, I waved my lantern." The case seemed to hinge on this one statement. A third time the attorney asked, "When the car approached, did you wave your lantern?" A third time the flagman said he did indeed wave his lantern.

Ultimately, the railroad won the case. Later, the defense attorney said to the flagman, "The prosecuting attorney really had me worried when he kept asking if you had waved the lantern." "Well," said the flagman, "what worried me was that he might ask, "Was the lantern lit?!"

I think that the take-home is this: you can yell and shout and wave your arms and jump up and down all you want. It won't make a bit of difference if no one can see you. And if your lantern isn't lit, then you may as well stay home. In the Gospel of John, Jesus says, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life." (John 8:12). Christ also tells us that "we are the light of the world. Let your light so shine before all people that they may see your good deeds and give glory to our Father in heaven." We, as followers of Christ are called to "Sea La Luz" or maybe more accurately, to live lives that reflect the light of Christ that is in us.



I don't have many dates to share with you this month. It's our time to shift gears and get all the curriculum, supplies and scheduling in place for fall. We have our last Intergenerational Sunday School coming up on Sunday, August 12th. It's a Membership project that people of all ages can help with and I am hoping for a good attendance that morning at 9 AM because all willing class

participants are going to be offered big and small ways to ultimately give EVERY active participant at our church a chance to help. This project is doable for pretty much all ages, so please join me in the Parlor that morning.

Sunday School will kick off for all ages on Sunday, September 9th. I am still looking for some help once or twice a month for 20 minutes or more. The spiritual gift of flexibility was put to the test changing our destination for our Sr High Mission Trip the week before we left. John & I ended up being the only adults able to go on the trip and 14 hours was too long of a drive with only 2 drivers so we selected Noble, Oklahoma as our destination. We repaired a trailer home damaged by flooding 3 years ago. There were holes through the floor, damage to the drywall and roof. We ripped out the floor in places replacing the subflooring, then did overlay and installed wood flooring. The kids learned how to use nail guns, saws, and all sorts of fun things. They worked hard and so well together as a team that we finished 1 1/2 days early and had a fun day at an area waterpark. I am so proud of how well they all got along, worked together and made sure the work was done beautifully.



The scripture quote comes from day two of working. The homeowner Rose was up and working each day but there was another couple that stayed in bed until around lunch time each day. I didn't learn until later that the man was grumpy with the kids for making noise so "early" when they were fixing up his home. He was ungrateful and unkind. I was also frustrated to see dirt and ashes on the new floor when we came back so we had to sweep before we could work. I've

used the reminder to work like you are working for God rather than people in the past and thought it was perfect for this occasion. We read it in 6 different translations just to make sure it stuck with us and it really did help us focus back on doing a good job instead of being frustrated with a seeming lack of appreciation. The day we finished Rose told me I had a beautiful family and should be so proud of the kids' hard work, kindness, and compassion. She said they were a blessing and walked away crying. I didn't interrupt her to correct her but since we're all a church family they were kind of my kiddos, right? I could not have been prouder of them.
