## 2019 Stewardship Planning – Grace and Gratitude

On the last two Sundays in September we'll be focusing on the 2019 Stewardship Campaign. Our congregation, children, and youth will be learning about the biblical concept of grace and gratitude through sermons, scripture readings, and a stewardship minute.



This month you will receive a stewardship letter with an *ESTIMATED* 2019 Operating Budget printed on the back. We hope this estimate of income and expenses will help you understand how our congregation can best use the contributions we receive to live out the mission and ministry to which we are called. Included with the letter will be a pledge card and a time and talent form. The pledge card will include a line for your one-year commitment to help retire the loan.

After prayerful consideration, please fill out the pledge card and time and talent form and bring them to worship on Commitment Sunday, September 30th. You will be invited to bring the card to the front of the Sanctuary for deposit in the Joash Chest, a visible symbol of people coming together to offer our gifts to God. You are also invited to leave your completed time and talent form in a basket when you bring your pledge card to the front.

Together let us prayerfully and thoughtfully learn more about what it means to more fully follow and rely on Jesus while loving and serving our community. As we grow in faith and service let us experience more deeply the joy of grace and gratitude.


### **Happenings**


### Hands on Mission Opportunity

The mission committee of First Presbyterian Church is sponsoring a mission outreach activity for **Friday**, **October 5th 12:00 to 3:30 pm** in the afternoon. We would like a minimum of 12 interested individuals to help pack supplies for the FoodBank for the Heartland BackPack program at the Foodbank Omaha location at 10525 J St, Omaha. The minimum age for participants is 16. One in five kids in Nebraska and western Iowa under the age of 18 is at-risk for hunger. Staff members at local elementary schools identify chronically hungry students then Food Bank for the Heartland supplies packs filled with nutritious food for those children to take home on Friday afternoons. Each pack provides two breakfast meals and two lunch or dinner meals. The BackPack Program distributes 8300 packs to children in need each week in 228 schools across Nebraska and western Iowa. Please consider participating with us on **October 5th** to help feed the hungry. Sign-up sheet is available in the Library.

### Operation Christmas Child

Children in 118 countries receive miracles through shoeboxes collected by Operation Christmas Child. Approximately 7,900,000 shoebox gifts in the United States, plus another 2,400,000 from nine other countries are donated.

The gift of a simple shoebox filled with toys, treats, and basic supplies will bring joy to the children and hope to their parents who can not offer their children even the simplest of gifts for Christmas.

#### **RETIRE CHURCH DEBT IN 2019**

In 2003 FPC took out a loan of almost \$1.7 million to finance our major building expansion and renovations. At the end of 2018, we will still have \$188,000 remaining on that loan. Our monthly payments are about \$6,300 with fixed interest at 3.7%. The balance in the building fund will cover the September to December 2018 payments. End of 2018 contributions will hopefully cover the first few (3-6) months of 2019---BUT NOT BEYOND.

What options do we have to retire the outstanding loan balance?

Retire debt by mid-2021. With next year's payments, the balance will still be about \$120,000 at the end of 2019. We will need about \$75,000 in 2020 and \$45,000 in 2021. Funding that amount will very negatively impact our future operating budgets. Many of you have been pledging and making payments to the ongoing campaign. FPC has been greatly blessed by your generosity; however, the current building campaign ends December 31, 2018.

**Fully retire the debt in 2019**. A very attractive alternative would be to pay off the loan. Thus there is the need for one more FINAL CAMPAIGN to fully retire our remaining debt next year.

A special **2019 Retire the Debt Pledge** line item on the 2019 Pledge Card gives you the opportunity to make as generous of a pledge as possible to this worthy goal of fully retiring the debt in 2019. Please prayerfully consider making a best estimate of your giving by entering your one-time final building pledge as part of the Stewardship Campaign. Of course, this pledge should be above and beyond your generous giving to the 2019 Operating Budget. If your tax situation warrants, consider prepaying part or all of your 2019 contributions prior to December 31, 2018.

### Children's Ministry

Have you noticed some of our mornings are starting to feel like Fall? Temperatures are getting crisp, football games are starting up and I hear a high school marching band practicing while I get ready for work in the morning. Fall IS here!

Say, have you traced around your hand yet, for our First Presbyterian Family Tree? I would like to get this project finished up in the next week or so, and if you are one of the people who hasn't added to our tree yet, please try to make it a point to stop at the table by the tree anytime Monday through Sunday. Our tree may look full, but it really isn't if we don't have everyone who is a part of our church family – whether you are a member or a regular visitor, and adult or a child. We want everyone to be a part of this!

Sunday School Kick Off is at 9 AM on Sunday, September  $9^{th}$ , in Fellowship Hall for children, youth and adults. We will have donuts, juice and coffee and then circle up in prayer before we break up to head to individual classrooms. At this time, our PreK  $-6^{th}$  grade teaching team is: Becca Griffin, Nora Boyd, Cindy Reilly, Rob Rose and myself. I'm still looking for one or two others to join in the fun. Sunday School is open to 3 year olds (who are potty-trained) through  $6^{th}$  grade.

WOW Kick Off is Wednesday, September 12<sup>th</sup>. We will begin with dinner at 5:30, followed by Music and Faith Education which end at 7 PM. WOW is open to Kindergartners through 6<sup>th</sup> graders. Sunday School is free but there is a \$50 annual fee (per child) for WOW, to cover the cost of the meals. We have been able to keep the cost the same for many years because of the careful budgeting of Head Cook, Mike Tabler. I know families are hit by many expenses at this time of year and if you would rather pay by the semester or if you need a scholarship for one or more of your children, please let me know. Scholarships are available, and there is absolutely no shame in asking!

Schedules and registration forms for all children's programming have been sent out to all families I have on the books. If you did not get a registration form, please let me know or pick one up on the table in the Parlor. I really appreciate getting

new forms for each year. It helps to keep my records accurate and classes divided appropriately. But I also need a new form each year to be up to date on medical situations and legally compliant on photo consent. I really love to take pictures at children's events and to post them on bulletin boards, my office door and our Facebook page (without names). Our kids are so cute!

Our original date for the presentation of 3<sup>rd</sup> grade Bibles was September 23<sup>rd</sup>. That has been changed to September 30<sup>th</sup>. If you have a child older than 3<sup>rd</sup> grade who has not received a Bible yet, please let me know. There will be two baptisms along with Bible presentation that day so it promises to be an extra special day for our church family.

Our first Family Movie Night is coming up on Sunday, October 14<sup>th</sup> at 5 PM. We will show Paddington 2. Movie Nights are free and open to all ages. We serve dinner first, watch the movie (with popcorn and treats) and all who are interested can stay for crafts. We have been getting a good turn out from people in the community – particularly Welcome School families and friends. I encourage you to reach out to visitors and make them feel welcome. I try to get around to everyone but too often I am running around like a chicken with my head cut off. And some of you are much better at talking to new people than I am, anyway. So your help is really appreciated.

Lastly, I want to give you a final report on VBS. We had 77 kids attend. Our food item count for the Bellevue Food Pantry was a record 1,285 items! That totally smashed our previous record. The kids really did want to help feed hungry people, but a big part of the motivation was to bring enough to hit the goal and be able to slime me on the last day. That goal was met early this year and the last couple of days, the competition continued just to be able to be part of the winning crew – the crew that actually got to do the sliming because they brought the most food. I try not to think about why they wanted to get to dump slime on me. Pictures of the sliming are on the wall outside my office. But next year, both Rob Rose and Pastor Mike have offered to be slimed as a reward for mission giving. We may set a whole new record, then!




We return to our regular schedule on September 9th with Sunday School at 9 am. We will meet with all the classes in the Library for Kick-off then break out into our individual classes.
