Your Word

"Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path." (Psalm 119:105)

For the past month or so I have been hinting about a challenge I have for the congregation. It is a challenge for all of our members, regardless of their age, whether they worship regularly or are shut-in, active in many activities or mostly inactive at this point in life.

This coming year will be an exciting time in the life of our congregation. I am challenging each one of you to read the entire Bible in one year. Every Book, every Letter, every Psalm; even the boring and confusing ones!

Many people tell me that they wish they knew the Bible better, but they aren't sure how to go about doing that. Reading the Bible straight through, cover to cover is one way to do just that. It gives you the big picture and shows you the grand sweep of God's involvement in human history in a way that nothing else can do.

I know that it seems like an imposing task to read the entire Bible in just one year. And I'll be the first to admit that the thoughts of reading Leviticus or Revelation is not exactly my idea of a good time. But, as it says in Psalm 119, God's Word is a lamp and a light for our way in life. Even the tough parts!

It may sound like an imposing task to read the entire Bible in one year, but it can be done much more easily than you might think. Just to put things in context, The Bible contains roughly 780,000 words. In comparison, "War and Peace" contains 560,000 words, The "Lord of the Rings" trilogy has 576,000 and "The Adventures of Huckleberry Finn" contains 190,000. Does that help ease your fears of committing to this project? Hmmm...

If you read for roughly 20 minutes per day for 365 days, it can be done rather easily. That works out to about three chapters of Scripture daily, 2 from the Old Testament and 1 from the New Testament. That seems more manageable, doesn't it?

It will be an exciting adventure for us, as a congregation, as we together read through Scripture in this way. I am sure that you will find 2019 to be an enriching and stimulating way to get to know the Bible better. I am looking forward to it and I hope you will accept the challenge and join me.

We will be using the book "The Year Of The Bible" by James E. Davison as our guide for this amazing



journey. In addition to providing the reading list, there are monthly articles to help guide you and allow you to work through difficult or less familiar parts of Scripture. Every first Sunday of the month I will have a sermon to help us to understand what we will be reading in the month ahead.

Our youth (who are already very excited about this project) and adults will be reading the entire Bible in 2019. For our elementary school-aged children, Linda and I will be developing a list of 52 Bible stories so that they may also participate in the challenge. I hope you join the invitation to accept this challenge. As for our youth, thank you for your enthusiasm. Care to challenge the adults to a read-off? Game on?

End of Year Contributions

To comply with IRS regulations, all contributions intended for the current year tax statement must be dated in the current year. These contributions should be turned in as early as possible and at least by the last day of the year.

The financial record for the current year will be

closed out on the last day of the current year. Contributions received after December 31st will be entered in the next year's record and will appear on the next year's statement. Contributions received after December 31 cannot be back dated.

Two ways to donate to the church and save Income Taxes

If you are over 59 ½ you can make a direct transfer from your Traditional IRA or other retirement account. Your finance institution can send a check directly to First Presbyterian Church and you will incur no income taxes on the transfer and it will count as part of your Required Minimum Distribution.

Give appreciated stock or mutual funds to First Presbyterian Church by completing some forms to transfer the stock from your brokerage account to the church's brokerage account (Foundation Fund). You will have no tax liability on the capital gains and neither will the church.

Example:

- ♦ You bought 100 shares @ \$10 which = \$1,000
- Market value on 12/15/18 is \$20 which = \$2,000
- You then have a \$1,000 capital gain
- You can now donate the \$1,000 original value and the \$1,000 capital gain to the church by transferring the funds to the church's brokerage account and eliminating the tax liability on the \$1,000 capital gain, since you never sell the stock and the funds go directly from the brokerage to the church.

PER CAPITA – PER PERSON

What is per capita? Per capita is important to being a Presbyterian! It is the way Presbyterians mutually share governance expenses to make mission and programs possible. It is how Presbyterians participate in the life of the Church universal as we commit ourselves to work and live in fellowship with "all persons in every nation."

The **required** total per capita amount due from each congregation is a combined request from the Presbytery of Missouri River Valley, Synod of Lakes and Prairies, and the General Assembly. We will owe \$39.55 for each active member. In 2019, our apportionment will be \$10,797.15. If we don't reach that amount from the per capita request, funds will be taken from somewhere else in our budget to ensure First Presbyterian meets the required per capita assessment.

Next Steps

Take a special per capita envelope from the name tag table. Include a check for \$39.55 for each church member in your family. Write your envelope # on your check. If you do not have the envelope, please write Per Capita in the memo portion of your check. Leave the envelope or check in the offering plate or the office by February 3rd. If you would like to prepay your Per Capita for next year just go ahead and place your envelope in the offering plate by December 31st this year.

Our church must pay our total per capita amount by February 15, 2019.

We haven't made it out of Genesis yet in Illuminate because there is so much to discuss. Starting with this scripture, how did they think they could hide from God?
