The Trouble With Angels

Then the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God." Luke 1:30

Encounters with angels are always a frightening thing. Maybe it's because we realize how close to God we have come and are afraid of what may happen next. Maybe it's because an encounter with an angel usually demands some sort of a commitment on our part or a change in our lives. Who knows exactly why encounters with angels are so frightening to us, but every story of an encounter with an angel in Scripture always starts with the angel delivering the classic line "Do not be afraid..."

Mary had just such an encounter with an angel. After the usual "Do not be afraid" greeting, the angel proceeded to give her the news about what God was to be about in her life. Talk about a surprise! This is the time of year that we focus on the Christmas story, starting with the encounters that Mary and Joseph and Zechariah had with angels. It's no wonder that we're a little leery of encountering an angel in real life!

When we look at stories involving angels in the New Testament, a visit by an angel is always a terrifying thing. But in the older parts of the Old Testament, especially in Genesis, angels always appear as ordinary people and it isn't until after the encounter that they are recognized for who they are. It seems to me that perhaps this is more likely the way in which you and I may have an encounter with an angel.

Advent is the time in the Church year that we stop to look both ways before we cross the street into a new year. We stop to look back at the amazing love that God has rained down on us in the person of Jesus Christ and we look ahead to that awesome and fearful day of the Lord when Christ will return in glory. These in between times in which we live are fertile grounds for having an encounter with an angel, or maybe even being used by God as an angel yourself!

As you spend these next few days decking the halls, as you place that angel on top of the tree, pause for a while and think about your life. Think about the many people that God has sent into your life. How many messengers has God sent your way to remind you of God's never ending love for you? More importantly though, spend some time in quiet reflection as you ponder where God may be calling you to go. Where is God sending you to be a messenger? To whom would God have you go and tell the Good News of Jesus Christ? Remember, "Do not be afraid!"



My family and I wish you all a very blessed and peaceful Christmas and a joyous New Year. My heart is full as I look back on this past year that we have served the Lord together. It has been a wonderful time and I am truly grateful for the opportunity to have shared this year with you.

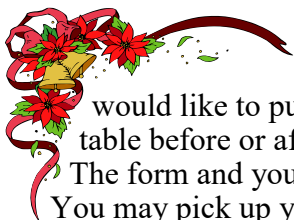

2019 STEWARDSHIP & RETIRE THEE DEBT CAMPAIGNS UPDATED RESULTS

As of November 19, 2018

Sunday, September 30, 2018, was Stewardship Commitment Sunday. 88 pledges have now been turned in totaling \$256,200. Our goal for 2019 is \$265,000 which is only about 1% higher than the amount pledged for this year.

To those of you who have already turned in your 2019 pledge, we thank you for your response and generosity. If you wish to pre-pay part or all of your 2019 pledge---be sure to do so before December 31, 2018.

Updated results for the "Retire The Debt in 2019" Campaign are 34 pledges totaling \$50,055. This is a good start to reaching our goal of FPC becoming totally debt free by the end of next year, or at the least, being able to sustain our monthly payments next year without negatively impacting our 2019 Operating Budget.

If you haven't turned in your 2019 pledges, please do so as soon as possible. Additional 2019 Stewardship Campaign and Retire The Debt pledge cards are available on the name tag table in the Narthex/Library. PER CAPITA – PER PERSON

What is per capita? Per capita is important to being a Presbyterian! It is the way Presbyterians mutually share governance expenses to make mission and programs possible. It is how Presbyterians participate in the life of the Church universal as we commit ourselves to work and live in fellowship with "all persons in every nation."

The **required** total per capita amount due from each congregation is a combined request from the Presbytery of Missouri River Valley, Synod of Lakes and Prairies, and the General Assembly. We will owe **\$39.55** for each active member. In 2019, our apportionment will be **\$10,797.15**. If we don't reach that amount from the per capita request, funds will be taken from somewhere else in our budget to ensure First Presbyterian meets the required per capita assessment.

Next Steps

Take a special per capita envelope from the name tag table. Include a check for **\$39.55** for each church member in your family. Write your envelope # on your check. If you do not have the envelope, please write Per Capita in the memo portion of your check. Leave the envelope or check in the offering plate or the office by February 3rd. If you would like to prepay your Per Capita for next year just go ahead and place your envelope in the offering plate by December 31st this year.

Our church must pay our total per capita amount by February 15, 2019.

Two ways to donate to the church and save Income Taxes

If you are over 59 ½ you can make a direct transfer from your **Traditional IRA** or other retirement account. Your finance institution can send a check directly to First Presbyterian Church and you will incur **no income taxes** on the transfer and it **will** count as part of your **Required Minimum Distribution**.

Give appreciated stock or mutual funds to First Presbyterian Church by completing some forms to **transfer the stock** from your **brokerage account** to the church's brokerage account (Foundation Fund). You will have **no tax liability** on the capital gains and neither will the church.

Example:

- ◆ You bought 100 shares @ \$10 which = \$1,000
- ◆ Market value on 12/15/18 is \$20 which = \$2,000
- ◆ You then have a \$1,000 capital gain
- ◆ You can now donate the \$1,000 original value and the \$1,000 capital gain to the church by transferring the funds to the church's brokerage account and eliminating the tax liability on the \$1,000 capital gain, since you never sell the stock and the funds go directly from the brokerage to the church.
