PER CAPITA - PER PERSON

What is per capita? Per capita is important to being a Presbyterian! It is the way Presbyterians mutually share governance expenses to make mission and programs possible. It is how Presbyterians participate in the life of the Church universal as we commit ourselves to work and live in fellowship with "all persons in every nation."

The **required** total per capita amount due from each congregation is a combined request from the Presbytery of Missouri River Valley, Synod of Lakes and Prairies, and the General Assembly. We will owe \$39.55 for each active member. In 2019, our apportionment will be \$10,797.15. If we don't reach that amount from the per capita request, funds will be taken from somewhere else in our budget to ensure First Presbyterian meets the required per capita assessment.

Next Steps

Take a special per capita envelope from the name tag table. Include a check for \$39.55 for each church member in your family. Write your envelope # on your check. If you do not have the envelope, please write Per Capita in the memo portion of your check. Leave the envelope or check in the offering plate or the office by February 3rd.

Our church must pay our total per capita amount by February 15, 2019.

2019 Stewardship & Retire the Debt Campaign

Update Results As of December 17, 2018

Sunday, September 30, 2018, was Stewardship Commitment Sunday. 89 pledges have now been turned in totaling \$256,500. Our goal for 2019 is \$265,000 which is only about 1% higher than the amount pledged for this year.

To those of you who have already turned in your 2019 pledge, we thank you for your response and generosity. If you have not pledged, please contribute as generously as possible to the 2019 Operating Budget.

Updated results for the "Retire The Debt in 2019" Campaign are 34 pledges totaling \$50,055. This is a good start to reaching our goal of FPC becoming totally debt free by the end of next year, or at the least, being able to sustain our monthly payments next year without negatively impacting our 2019 Operating Budget. If you haven't turned in your 2019 pledge cards, please do so as soon as possible. Additional 2019 Stewardship Campaign and Retire The Debt in 2019 pledge cards are available on the name tag table. For those of you who haven't pledged but are regularly contributing to one or both campaigns, we sincerely thank you.

Two ways to donate to the church and save Income Taxes

If you are over 59 ½ you can make a direct transfer from your Traditional IRA or other retirement account. Your finance institution can send a check directly to First Presbyterian Church and you will incur no income taxes on the transfer and it will count as part of your Required Minimum Distribution.

Give appreciated stock or mutual funds to First Presbyterian Church by completing some forms to transfer the stock from your brokerage account to the church's brokerage account (Foundation Fund). You will have no tax liability on the capital gains and neither will the church.

Example:

- You bought 100 shares @ \$10 which = \$1,000
- Market value on 12/15/18 is \$20 which = \$2,000
- You then have a \$1,000 capital gain
- You can now donate the \$1,000 original value and the \$1,000 capital gain to the church by transferring the funds to the church's brokerage account and eliminating the tax liability on the \$1,000 capital gain, since you never sell the stock and the funds go directly from the brokerage to the church.


