#### **Lent: A Season of Mercy**

While Jesus was having dinner at Matthew's house, many tax collectors and sinners came and ate with him and his disciples. When the Pharisees saw this, they asked his disciples, "Why does your teacher eat with tax collectors and sinners?" On hearing this, Jesus said, "It is not the healthy who need a doctor, but the sick. But go and learn what this means: 'I desire mercy, not sacrifice.' For I have not come to call the righteous, but sinners." (Matthew 9:10-13)

In just a few short days, another season of Lent will be beginning. Setting aside the forty days leading up to Easter Sunday as a special time has been a church tradition since as early as 325 AD. Lent is a special time of prayer, penance, sacrifice and good works in preparation of the celebration of Easter. Depending on the denomination, more or less emphasis is placed on things like fasting and sacrifice, but there is no doubt that a major emphasis of Lent has been on self-denial. I can still remember as a kid, hearing the priest remind us in church that if Jesus could suffer for us on the cross, we could certainly suffer without chocolate or sweets or some such thing for only a mere forty days!!! While I can understand his sentiment, I'm not sure that such a mindset is very helpful for most of us. Maybe there are others ways that we can keep Lent that are more meaningful to us.

This Lent we will again be doing our five week Lenten Supper and Bible Study beginning on Thursday, March 13th at 6PM and running until Thursday, April 11th. Dinner will be provided each night by various groups within the church and a free-will offering will be taken to help defray the cost of the meal.

Linda Reffert and I will be providing the program. It will follow a similar format to last year where we start with some music, spend some time together sharing Scripture and then work together in small groups as we listen for how God is speaking to us through those passages.

As Linda and I were looking at the Old Testament and Gospel readings for the Sunday's in Lent for this year, one common theme seems to run deeply through both the Old and the New Testament passages for each week. But they provide very different viewpoints on that theme. For example on March 28 we will be talking about mercy. While not necessarily a typical word we associate with Lent, the Scriptures invite us to share how God shows mercy to us, how we can show mercy to the people in our life and even to how we can show mercy to ourselves. Other themes we will be sharing with each other are: wilderness, generosity, shame and

covenant.

We hope you can join us. This will be a time of good food, good fellowship, good discussion and good fun as we share together in the Word and the season. It is also a great way to try out your newly acquired "Through the Bible in a Year" skills! Sign-up sheets will be available in the Library. This is an excellent time to invite your friends or neighbors to join us as well.




#### **Open Doors, Open Hearts**

#### **DEBT PAY-OFF CAMPAIGN UPDATE**

As of February 10, 2019

First Presbyterian Church's outstanding building loan balance is now down to \$177,150. In July 2013, the balance stood at \$750,000. The monthly loan payment is \$6,372.98. Through regular monthly payments, the loan will not be paid off until the Summer of 2021.

The DEBT PAY-OFF FUND currently contains \$35,002. With continuing pledged and non-pledged, contributions we should be able to make loan payments for all of 2019 and perhaps the first couple of months of 2020 without negatively impacting the Operating Budget.

FIRST PRES NEEDS YOUR HELP. If you have not pledged, or you are not contributing to the Debt Pay-Off Campaign, we prayerfully ask you to do so. Wouldn't it be marvelous if we could have the loan fully paid off by early 2020? Please use the RED pledge card located on the name tag table.
