Another First

Why, my soul, are you downcast? Why so disturbed within me? Put your hope in God, for I will yet praise him, my Savior and my God. My soul is downcast within me; therefore I will remember you from the land of the Jordan, the heights of Hermon—from Mount Mizar. Deep calls to deep in the roar of your waterfalls; all your waves and breakers have swept over me. By day the Lord directs his love, at night his song is with me—a praver to the God of mv life. (from Ps 42)

It seems to me that Nebraska is destined to be a land of firsts. Some good, some bad. For the good, my first Runza, my first Husker game, my first glimpse of the stunning beauty of the Midwest. As for the bad, my first blizzard, my first tornado and now, my first flood.

I do not think that I will ever get over the things that I have seen this week. When trying to describe the flooding to friends and family that do not live here, I find myself at a loss for words. How do you describe a road that disappears into a sea of water? Or a neighborhood engulfed up to the rooftops by a river? Or the incredibly painful and disheartening thoughts of friends and family and neighbors who have lost everything. This is not a good first for me, to say the least! I do not think that I will ever be able to process and grasp the magnitude of this past week.

These words from Psalm 42 are the words that come to my mind and I think on where we are right now. It is a Psalm that takes on the exact feelings that we are having. We know now, if we hadn't before, what it means for those waves and breakers to wash over us. We know what it means to be downcast. We know how disturbing the reality of this epic flood is. But can we remember too, in the midst of despair, the love song God sings to us both day and night? Or the praise that is hard to voice right now?

As always, times like these bring to mind those two unspeakable and unanswerable questions. Where is God? Why has God let this happen to us? They are good questions, but they are dangerous ones as well. When I was ordained, one promise that I, personally, made to God was that I would not be His apologist. I cannot speak for God and I cannot explain how God chooses to act or remain inactive.

But I can tell you this. Just as Jesus commanded his disciples to feed the 5000, so God does with us. You feed them! They are your friends and neighbors. You feed them. Be my hands and heart and voice. I want you to, Just trust me.

We are a small congregation. We cannot house the refugees from Bellevue. It is impossible. We cannot do big things. But by God Almighty, we can do many small things. Mother Teresa says, "Not all of us can do



great things. But we can do small things with great love."

We can all get a gift card or some bleach or some clothes and bring them to Bellevue Christian Center or the Chamber of Commerce here in town. We can all donate food to the Bellevue Food Pantry through our church. We can lend a hand to our fellow church members in clean-up. We can help sing that love song for God.

This flood and its lingering tragedy is not going to be gone in a week. That is when the tough work of love begins. So, are we in it for the long haul?

DEBT PAY-OFF CAMPAIGN UPDATE

As of March 24, 2019

First Presbyterian Church's outstanding building loan balance is now down to \$171,287. In July 2013, the balance stood at \$750,000. The monthly loan payment is \$6,372.98. Through regular monthly payments, the loan will not be paid off until the Summer of 2021.

The DEBT PAY-OFF FUND currently contains \$36,927. With continuing pledged and non-pledged, contributions we should be able to make loan payments for all of 2019 and perhaps the first couple of months of 2020 without negatively impacting the Operating Budget.

FIRST PRES NEEDS YOUR HELP. If you have not pledged, or you are not contributing to the Debt Pay-Off Campaign, we prayerfully ask you to do so. Wouldn't it be marvelous if we could have the loan fully paid off by early 2020? Please use the RED pledge card located on the name tag table.
