With a Whimper

"King Nebuchadnezzar took into exile in Babylon those who had escaped from the sword, and they became servants to him and to his sons until the establishment of the kingdom of Persia, to fulfill the word of the Lord by the mouth of Jeremiah, until the land had made up for its Sabbaths. All the days that it lay desolate it kept Sabbath, to fulfill seventy years." (2 Chronicles 36:20-21)

As the unified nation of Israel and the subsequent kingdoms of Israel (the northern 10 tribes) and Judah (the Southern two tribes) fell further and further into sin, with idolatry being the most frequent, God allowed those curses foretold from way back in Deuteronomy 28 to come to be. First Israel (the Northern Kingdom aka Samaria) falls to the Assyrian King Sargon II in 722 BCE. Later Judah will fall to King Nebuchadnezzar of Babylon in 586 BCE. With a whimper God's beloved children will lose everything. Family, friends, the Promised Land, the Temple in Jerusalem, their very freedom and go into exile in a land far from home. For 70 years, until King Cyrus of Persia allows the Jews to return and rebuild Jerusalem, the people sit in exile in a foreign land. Whimpering and wondering and whining.

Your "Through The Bible In A Year" readings for July (yes, you are over half way through the Bible now!) will come from the Books of Ezra and Nehemiah. These are the last of the books in the Old Testament that follow the chronological history of God's chosen people. What remains to be read will be the "Wisdom" literature and the Prophets. These are not chronological.


Ezra and Nehemiah continue the story of the rebuilding of the Temple and Jerusalem at the end of the Babylonian captivity. The Persian Empire takes over the Babylonian Empire and King Cyrus of Persia will allow the captives to return to Judah. As you will read in Ezra/Nehemiah, this is a difficult time for everyone. These books are a fascinating read.

The second half of July we will be reading from the Book of Job. Good old, long suffering Job. The first book of what we call Wisdom Literature. It is also considered to be one of the oldest books of the Bible...remember, after Ezra/Nehemiah, the remaining books of the Old testament are not in any chronological order. Job deals with one of the oldest questions that face humanity: Is there a connection between sin and suffering? Or, to put it another way, do we always get what we deserve.

I find it refreshing and comforting to know that humanity has been wondering about this for thousands of years. For Job, he wanted to know not only why but where God was in his suffering. Don't we all?

So for you "Through The Bible" participants, the month of July represents an interesting shift in focus for us in our journey through the Old Testament. I can't wait, can you?



We are currently hiring for the Children's Choir Director position with an effective start date of August 1st. If you are interested please contact Linda Reffert at lkreffert@aol.com.

This position includes the following requirements: (additional requirements are not listed)

- ♦ Coordinate, instruct and lead music ministry for our children ages PreK through 6th grade.
- ♦ Provide inspiration and leadership for an enjoyable music experience as part of the curriculum for children enrolled in the W.O.W. program for one hour each Wednesday evening during the program's school year term and children enrolled in the Church School program for one hour each Sunday during the nine month school term, and for 3 hours each day during our one week summer VBS program.
- Design, develop and coordinate a Children's Christmas program for worship with the Pastor/ Head of Staff, Chancel Choir Director and Organist
- Provide accompaniment on the piano, CD player or computer during all children's rehearsals.
- ♦ Coordinate with the Pastor/ Head of Staff, Director of Children's Ministries, Chancel Choir Director, and the Worship Committee the schedule for children's involvement in worship or special services.
- ◆ Design, develop and coordinate a Children's Christmas program for worship with the Pastor/ Head of Staff, Chancel Choir Director and Organist.
- Select music for and rehearse the children's vocal choir.
- ♦ Receive input from the Director of Children's Ministries in the selection of the music to coordinate it with the emphasis of the children's curriculum.
- ◆ Provide input to the Worship Committee regarding budget for music or other needs of the children's music ministry.
- Coordinate use of materials, music equipment and facilities with other music staff.

DEBT PAY-OFF CAMPAIGN UPDATE

As of June 16, 2019

First Presbyterian Church's outstanding building loan balance is now down to \$153,733. In July 2013, the balance stood at \$750,000. The monthly loan payment is \$6,372.98. Through regular monthly payments, the loan will not be paid off until the Summer of 2021.

The DEBT PAY-OFF FUND currently contains only \$25,299. With continuing pledged and non-pledged, contributions we should be able to make loan payments for all of 2019 and perhaps the first month or two of 2020 without negatively impacting the Operating Budget.

FIRST PRES NEEDS YOUR HELP. If you have not pledged, or you are not contributing to the Debt Pay-Off Campaign, we prayerfully ask you to do so. Wouldn't it be marvelous if we could have the loan fully paid off by early 2020? Please use the RED pledge card located on the name tag table. We had women from ages 9 to 90+ and it all just flowed so smoothly. I have had multiple requests to schedule another retreat soon and I am looking at fall dates as I write this. I would particularly appreciate a Food Coordinator, but you may have ideas for sessions too, or some other aspect and I am certainly open to new ideas.

We had a wonderful time at Camp Calvin Crest on our Middle School Mission trip. The youth led morning and evening worship and this year each kiddo picked their own scripture. I will be sharing them in my newsletters the next few months.

The above scripture really came in handy during

this years trip. We built a sidewalk to one of the fully accessible cabins so campers in wheel chairs won't get



bogged down in mud. The bags of cement were 60 lbs each and we added 1-2 gallons of water to each bag. Our second day we hand mixed the cement in wheelbarrows which made everything go faster but watching the youth carry bags and dump wheelbarrows that weigh about as much as they do was equal parts funny and frightening. They worked so hard and did such a great job! The camp fix-it man Bob was so impressed by the progress he framed in 20 additional feet and bought another pallet of cement for the second day. Total of concrete poured - 250 square feet using about 200

bags of concrete. We were a tired bunch when we got home Sunday but it was so rewarding to get all of that work done to help them with their campers arriving the next week.



We are heading to Triennium July 15th. It's coming up so quickly and I know everyone is getting very excited. We will meet at our church 9:30 pm Monday night, load the busses and depart around midnight for our drive to Purdue. Please keep us in your prayers. This is a fantastic and inspirational adventure and we thank you for your support which enables 13 of us to attend.
