
## Happenings

## Children's Ministry

It's that time! Sunday School and WOW are both starting up. I'm working away to get all my ducks in a row so we can have an awesome start. Before I launch into anything about Fall though, let me just give a final thanks and numbers for VBS. When I wrote my August newsletter article, VBS has barely begun.

Thanks to so many of you, we had the biggest VBS staff we have had during my tenure. Our number of enrolled students were down a bit and I was a little confused about why God led so many of you to volunteer, when He wasn't sending more kids. We had 68, which is a good number, but it was down a bit. But gosh, the needs of some of the kids who came made it quickly apparent why we needed more help! We had kids attend who were facing health challenges, family challenges and trauma we would not wish on anyone, let alone a child. All VBS kids deserve to be known and loved but thanks to the extra help we had, we could provide extra love and attention where it was desperately needed. Thank you SO much! And thanks to the congregation members who answered Pastor Mike's challenge to boost our donations to the Bellevue Food Pantry. The VBS kids brought a lot of food, but we were able to smash to smithereens our previous donation totals. We donated more than 3,700 items to the Bellevue Food Pantry.

Now for fall, I will try to be brief where I can, because I have so many things I want to address and June won't let me have the whole newsletter! Sunday school begins for all ages with donuts, juice, coffee and a group blessing at 9 AM on September 8<sup>th</sup>, in Fellowship Hall. WOW begins with dinner at 5:30 on Wednesday, September 11<sup>th</sup>. CE leaders and helpers for all ages and programming will be commissioned in worship on the 8<sup>th</sup>.

Session approved a new Health Policy for all church programming. It is a policy meant to get us all on the same page about what types of health challenges should keep us home, for the protection of others. If you are the parent of a child participating in Sunday School or WOW, please be sure you sign the back side (or 2<sup>nd</sup> page) of the 2019-20 Registration form. For adults who participate in programming at the

church, it would be a great idea for you to read through and follow this policy too. No one wants to be sick, but we have people in our congregation with suppressed immune systems and they especially should not be exposed to contagious illnesses. Even if you are so tough you keep on going when you are sick, please note this policy.

The cost of WOW is \$50 per child per year. This is primarily to cover food costs. We welcome guests and give them a bargain price of \$2 per session. Please do not ever let cost keep you from participating in any of our programming! It is fine to pay \$25 per semester, instead of the whole year. And we have scholarship money just waiting to be used if that would be helpful. There are so many expenses with kids, especially at the start of a school year! Third graders will be presented with Bibles in worship on Sunday, September 22<sup>nd</sup>. If you have an older child who did not receive a Bible in 3<sup>rd</sup> grade, please let me know and they can be added to the list, or given a Bible privately.

The fall Family Movie Night is Sunday, October 6<sup>th</sup>. We will gather at 5 PM for a FREE kid-friendly dinner, then show the Disney movie Coco and we will conclude the evening with crafts for kids who are interested. We would love to have you join us and we welcome guests from your family Welcome School and the community.

God & The Girls Intergenerational Retreat has been moved to Saturday, November 2<sup>nd</sup> from 9 to Noon. All females, ages from 9 and up are welcome. Last time, our theme was Relationships and I strongly encouraged you to bring someone special with you. This time our theme will be Gratitude and while you are welcome and encouraged to bring a special guest, it isn't an expectation. I hope all who attend will walk out the doors with a smile on their face and a more conscious awareness of how very much God loves them. I am still hopeful for a Food Coordinator to join our leadership team.

Sunday school teaching staff will be Nora Boyd, Becca Griffin and myself most Sundays. Deb Hudson and Cindy Reilly will help us as needed. As of this moment, we still have not filled the Children's Music position. It is a paying position and we really want an experienced children's music teacher, so it's a pretty specialized need. Keep thinking about who you might know. In the meantime, I am scrambling to figure out how to make sure we have music as a regular part of our WOW and Sunday School. Music is just so important!
