## Advent

*“There will be signs in the sun, the moon, and the stars, and on the earth distress among nations confused by the roaring of the sea and the waves. People will faint from fear and foreboding of what is coming upon the world, for the powers of the heavens will be shaken. Then they will see ‘the Son of Man coming in a cloud’ with power and great glory. Now when these things begin to take place, stand up and raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near.”*

*Then he told them a parable: “Look at the fig tree and all the trees; as soon as they sprout leaves you can see for yourselves and know that summer is already near. So also, when you see these things taking place, you know that the kingdom of God is near. Truly I tell you, this generation will not pass away until all things have taken place. Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away. “Be on guard so that your hearts are not weighed down with dissipation and drunkenness and the worries of this life, and that day catch you unexpectedly, like a trap. For it will come upon all who live on the face of the whole earth. Be alert at all times, praying that you may have the strength to escape all these things that will take place, and to stand before the Son of Man.” (Luke 21:25-36)*

Advent is a funny time of year. As we journey towards Christmas through the month of December we expect to hear stories from Scripture about the Christmas story. Angels and shepherds and that sort of stuff. Yet, we begin our journey to Christmas with a scary vision of the end of times when Christ will return in glory.

Today we enter the season of Advent. The word advent means “coming.” Advent is the season in the church year when we prepare to receive the promise of Christmas. And here’s the promise of Christmas: God is going to come to us wrapped in human flesh to build the kingdom of God. God is going to bring heaven and earth just a bit closer, close enough that crying will cease, that suffering will end and peace and justice and love will be all that remains. And that blessed day of Christ’s return will fulfill our heart’s desire. It is a promise God has made to us.

The promise of Christmas is that even though this world can and too often feels full of pain and fear, terror and heartbreak, God’s presence remains with us through this all. God is our Emmanuel; God with us. God has come to us in Jesus Christ and God will come again in Jesus Christ. Raise your heads. Be alert. Be prepared. Be faithful.



Jesus’ words, in Luke’s Gospel, were words of comfort to those who heard them: those frightening, bold, beautiful glimpses of God coming into the world; comfort and healing balm to those who had long been suffering, to those who cried out for justice and longed for the promises of God. And they are also for us, who wait for Christ’s return with the same longings and needs. Advent is about looking around at the state of the world, at the wars and the violence, the brokenness and the need and longing for God to come again and finish that new creation we have been waiting for in hope.

## 2020 STEWARDSHIP CAMPAIGN

Results as of November 17, 2019



Sunday, September 29<sup>th</sup> was Stewardship Commitment Sunday. We have now received 81 pledges totaling \$252,206. The average pledge is over \$3,000 or over \$250 per month. Our goal for 2020 is for pledges of \$267,000 which is about 3% higher than the amount pledged for this year.

To those of you have already turned in your 2020 pledge, thank you for your generosity. If you wish to pre-pay part or all of your 2020 pledge---be sure to do so before December 31, 2019.

## DEBT PAY-OFF CAMPAIGN UPDATE

As of November 17, 2019

First Presbyterian Church's outstanding building loan balance is now down to \$124,101. In July 2013, the balance stood at \$750,000. The monthly loan payment is \$6,372.98. Through regular monthly payments, the loan will not be paid off until the Summer of 2021.

The **DEBT PAY-OFF FUND** currently contains only \$5,500. Hopefully, with continuing pledged and non-pledged contributions we should be able to make loan payments for all of 2019 and perhaps the first month or two of 2020 without negatively impacting the Operating Budget.

**FIRST PRES NEEDS YOUR HELP.** If you have not pledged, or you are not contributing to the Debt Pay-Off Campaign, we prayerfully ask you to do so. Wouldn't it be marvelous if we could have the loan fully paid off by early 2020? Please use the RED pledge card located on the name tag table. Please continue to use the PINK envelopes for your contributions.

## End of Year Contributions

To comply with IRS regulations, all contributions intended for the current year tax statement must be dated in the current year. These contributions should be turned in as early as possible and at least by the last day of the year. The financial record for the current year will be closed out on the last day of the current year.

Contributions received after December 31st will be entered in the next year's record and will appear on the next year's statement. Contributions received after December 31 cannot be back dated.

## Two ways to donate to the church and save on income taxes

As we look at the 2020 pledge drive and wiping out the last \$116K of the church mortgage, we thought it good timing to share the tax savings approaches.

1. If you are over 59 ½ you can make a direct transfer from your Traditional IRA or other retirement account. Your finance institution can send a check directly to First Presbyterian Church and you will incur no income taxes on the transfer and it will count as part of your Required Minimum Distribution.
2. Give appreciated stock or mutual funds to First Presbyterian Church by completing some forms to transfer the stock from your brokerage account to the church's brokerage account (Foundation Fund). You will have no tax liability on the capital gains and neither will the church.

Example:

- ◆ You bought 100 shares @ \$10 which = \$1,000
- ◆ Market value on 12/15/18 is \$20 which = \$2,000
- ◆ You then have a \$1,000 capital gain
- ◆ You can now donate the \$1,000 original value and the \$1,000 capital gain to the church by transferring the funds to the church's brokerage account and eliminating the tax liability on the stock or \$1,000 capital gain, since you never sell the stock and the funds go directly from the brokerage to the church. The full value of \$2,000 is tax deductible if you still itemize you deductions.

## Per Capita – Per person

What is per capita? Per capita is important to being a Presbyterian! It is the way Presbyterians mutually share governance expenses to make mission and programs possible. It is how Presbyterians participate in the life of the Church universal as we commit ourselves to work and live in fellowship with "all persons in every nation."

The **required** total per capita amount due from each congregation is a combined request from the Presbytery of Missouri River Valley, Synod of Lakes and Prairies, and the General Assembly. We will owe **\$39.65** for each active member. In 2020, our apportionment will be **\$11,141.65**. If we don't reach that amount from the per capita request, funds will be taken from somewhere else in our budget to ensure First Presbyterian meets the required per capita assessment.

### Next Steps

Take a special per capita envelope from the name tag table. Include a check for **\$39.65** for each church member in your family. Write your envelope # on your check. If you do not have the envelope, please write Per Capita in the memo portion of your check. Leave the envelope or check in the offering plate or the office by February 9th. If you would like to prepay your Per Capita for next year just go ahead and place your envelope in the offering plate by December 31st this year.

Our church must pay our total per capita amount by February 15, 2020.

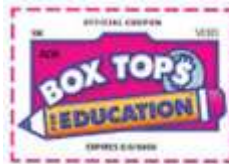
