Disconnect

"The angel said to him, "I am Gabriel. I stand in the presence of God, and I have been sent to speak to you and to tell you this good news. And now you will be silent and not able to speak until the day this happens, because you did not believe my words, which will come true at their appointed time."" Lk 1:19-20.

A few weeks after I wrote my sermon about Zechariah and his God imposed 9 months of silence, this story appeared on Fox News:

"John Mark Comer reached his breaking point as head of a Portland, Ore., megachurch when he was exhausted after leading six services every Sunday. He ended up stepping down, stressed out at a time of great success.

The Bridgetown Church pastor used to believe the biggest problem for American Christians was liberalism, secularism or the breakdown of the family. But he now has a different answer and outlook on life, based on advice from his mentor.

"I think, in all honesty, it is hurry," the 39-year-old pastor told Fox News.

The author of "The Ruthless Elimination of Hurry" said the root of many problems in our country go back to people being too busy, too hurried, too distracted or too exhausted to enjoy God and others.


The pastor points to what he calls Jesus' great invitation in Matthew 11:28-30 as the answer: "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest."

He calls this counter-cultural because the average millennial spends five and a half hours on their phone per day -- and so many are addicted to binging on Netflix, getting likes on Instagram, and scrolling Facebook and Twitter.

On a practical level, Comer encourages people to limit themselves from being constantly distracted by phones and digital devices, and cultivate a daily time of quiet to sit, pray, process, and be still before God. He calls this "massive and life-changing."

So here is my challenge for you for 2020. It is a two parter. Both parts require just one thing though. Disconnect. Spend some time with just yourself. And God.

The first part of the challenge is easy. Try it for one half hour each day in January and see how you feel at the end of the month. This challenge requires no reading, no supplies, nothing to buy or carry with you. All you



For the second part, try disconnecting from all of the electronic noise in your life for two hours each day (sleeping doesn't count!). No cell phone, no Facebook, no computer. Let the crazy world of social media go on without you. Rediscover life before the internet. Relax and do something old school. Read a book. Take a walk. Make some cookies for your pastor!

After one month, see how you feel. I suspect that you will continue into February. And beyond.








2020 STEWARDSHIP CAMPAIGN

DEBT PAY-OFF CAMPAIGN UPDATE

As of December 15, 2019

Our outstanding building loan balance is now \$118,110. The monthly loan payment is \$6,372.98. Through regular monthly payments, the loan will not be paid off until the Summer of 2021.

The Debt Pay-Off Fund currently contains \$23,700 not enough to make all of the 2020 or 2021 payments. We need your help. Please prayerfully consider making a donation to help pay off this church debt.

Hopefully, with continuing contributions we should be able to make loan payments for at least part of 2020 without negatively impacting the Operating Budget. If we can pay off the balance in early 2020 we will save the church another \$4,000 in interest expense.

Per Capita – Per person

Per capita is important to being a Presbyterian! It is the way Presbyterians mutually share governance expenses to make mission and programs possible.

The **required** total per capita amount due from each congregation is a combined request from the Presbytery of Missouri River Valley, Synod of Lakes and Prairies, and the General Assembly. We will owe \$39.65 for each active member. In 2020, our apportionment will be \$11,102.00. If we do not reach that amount from the congregation, funds will be taken from somewhere else in our budget to ensure we meet the required per capita assessment.

Please take a special per capita envelope from the name tag table. Include a check for \$39.65 for each church member in your family. Write your envelope # on your check. If you do not have the envelope, please write Per Capita in the memo portion of your check. Leave the envelope or check in the offering plate or the office by February 9th. If you would like to prepay your Per Capita for next year just go ahead and place your envelope in the offering plate by December 31st this year.

Our church must pay our total per capita amount by February 15, 2020.





Two ways to donate to the church and save on income taxes

As we look at the 2020 pledge drive and wiping out the last \$118K of the church mortgage, we thought it good timing to share the tax savings approaches.

- 1. If you are over 59 ½ you can make a direct transfer from your Traditional IRA or other retirement account. Your finance institution can send a check directly to First Presbyterian Church and you will incur no income taxes on the transfer and it will count as part of your Required Minimum Distribution.
- 2. Give appreciated stock or mutual funds to First Presbyterian Church by completing some forms to transfer the stock from your brokerage account to the church's brokerage account (Foundation Fund). You will have no tax liability on the capital gains and neither will the church.

Example:

- ♦ You bought 100 shares @ \$10 which = \$1,000
- Market value on 12/15/19 is \$20 which = \$2,000
- ♦ You then have a \$1,000 capital gain
- ♦ You can now donate the \$1,000 original value and the \$1,000 capital gain to the church by transferring the funds to the church's account and eliminating the tax liability on the stock or \$1,000 capital gain, since you never sell the stock and the funds go directly from the brokerage to the church. The full value of \$2,000 is tax deductible if you still itemize you deductions.


