#### Why are we opening back up?

We are grateful for the technology that has allowed us to safely "distance" from other people. Technologies like Zoom and Facebook have made an impossible situation bearable. But they are not permanent solutions. Everything we do is about relationship and "distancing" is not good for relationships in the long term.



Worship is a very risky business. Risky because we do not know how and when we may encounter God or where God may be calling us to go. During this time of COVID-19, gathering to worship poses additional risks to our health. In order to be as safe as possible we will all have to work together and put the needs and concerns of others before our own. That is what it means to be a congregation who worships together. Reflecting the love of Christ by how we respect each other and care for each other. Here are some ways we can do that as we return to worship:

Strongly consider staying at home and continue to share in worship with us using Facebook Live

if:

You are considered to be "at risk".

You have a fever or do not feel well.

You are uncomfortable about returning to your church family at this time.

You have not been practicing social distance or may have been exposed to COVID.

Maintain social distance of 6 or more feet of space.

Sanitize your hands immediately upon entering the church.

Do not share objects.

Wearing a mask while you are in the building for worship is a requirement. (Masks will not be provided)

#### Plan for Reopening Church after COVID-19 Closure

- Social distancing must be maintained at all times.
- Access to the church will be through the main door only.

## Pastor Article, Continued

- An usher/greeter will open the front door and ensure that all who enter use hand sanitizer.
- The use of masks while in the building is required by Session.
- Only the Library, Sanctuary and main floor bathrooms will be open to the public. Children under 12 must be accompanied by an adult in the restrooms.
- There will be no nursery or cry room available.
- No coffee hour will be provided prior to worship nor will the Library or Lobby be used for congregating either before or after worship.
- The Sanctuary will be capped at 50% capacity and places to sit will be clearly indicated. This will allow for approximately 130 people to worship in person.
- No bulletins will be available. All worship materials will be onscreen only. The Sunday bulletin will be emailed the Wednesday before worship so worshippers can print their own copy if they desire.
- Children's worship bags will not be made available.
- There will be a basket for offerings outside of the Sanctuary.
- A children's sermon will not be offered on the Sanctuary steps.
- Friendship registers, prayer request cards, offering plates and communion serving materials will not be used.
- On Communion Sundays, ushers will use gloves to pass out individual communion supplies to worshippers as they enter the Sanctuary prior to worship.
- Please arrive no earlier than 10:15. An usher will seat you.
- At the end of worship, the ushers will dismiss worshippers one row at a time beginning from the rear of the Sanctuary. Please do not congregate inside of the church building.

#### DEBT PAY-OFF CAMPAIGN UPDATE As of June 15, 2020

More Good News---FPC loan balance currently stands at \$81,812. However, the Debt Pay-Off account contains only \$17,062 which will pay the monthly payments only for the next 2-3 months---without negatively impacting the church's operating budget.

Please continue with your contributions. If you plan to make a significant end of year payment, please consider making it sooner rather than later so we can continue making the required monthly payments through December 2020. And if we can pay-off the remaining debt this year rather than later in 2021, we can save the church another \$1,000 to \$2,000, in interest expense.
