Debt Pay-Off Campaign Update

As of July 27, 2020

FPC loan balance currently stands at \$75,691. the Debt Pay-Off account now contains \$24,876 which will pay the monthly payments for August thru November 2020.

Please continue with your contributions. If you plan to make a significant end of year payment, please consider making it sooner rather than later so we can make the required December 2020 monthly payment. And if we can pay-off the then remaining debt of about \$35,000 by January 2021, we can save the church another \$1,500, in interest expense.

When I wrote last month's article, it was the very day that our Summer WOW Camp began. I was nervous and excited. As I write this, we have finished 5 out of 6 sessions. It has gone so well! I am so thankful to the great team who helped plan and carry it out and to the volunteers who helped on a one-time basis. It was really fun to have Ash Hudson help with a couple of sessions from Montreal! She had hoped to come back this summer and help with VBS. That wasn't possible, but because we ran Summer WOW over Zoom, she could be part of our team. She prepared a really neat power point presentation about college life in Montreal and put things in terms the kids (and I) could really relate to. And she led them in a couple of games. What a great gift!

The Summer WOW kids did 2 mission projects that I'd like to share with you. Cindy Reilly put together a Bingo sheet. Each time a child completed a task on the sheet, they got to mark the box the item was listed in. Every task was positive, helpful and/or encouraging to others. The kids could complete multiple Bingos on their sheets. Each time a Bingo was registered, the kids were to report in and each Bingo was worth \$10 toward a donation to sponsor an animal at the Zoo. The kids chose that particular cause and the cash behind the donation came from an anonymous source. I will have to let you know next month what animal(s) we ended up sponsoring through the kids efforts.

Our other mission project was collecting food for the Bellevue Food Pantry. We sure appreciate the congregation helping with our collection! I didn't see

everyone who dropped off food, but please know we are grateful. And the Pantry clients will appreciate it even more! We ended up collecting **820** items! The last few summers, we have set goals for VBS food collections and when the kids reached the goal, they got to slime one of our VBS leadership team or Pastor. This year we couldn't do the slime, but we had some gift certificates donated that we gave away as prizes for 6 different goals, such as: Most donated, healthiest, most variety, etc. Again, I'll have to wait for next month to let you know who the winners were.

Trying to plan for fall is a challenge! We don't know if we will have Sunday School or WOW in person or via Zoom. I've been polling our families about their preferences and comfort levels. My results will go to the CE committee and then to the session who will ultimately decide our plan. There may be leaders who could use the same plans to teach in person or by internet, but I am not one of them! So, I'm trying to prepare enough to at least get started in any possible scenario. This is hard on me, on our kids and parents and on our volunteers. That said, what hasn't been hard about adapting to changes that are necessary for safety during Covid? That's just the reality. I keep imagining a year or 2 years from now and having Covid behind us. It's a lovely thought that I sure hope becomes a reality!

And finally, I'm starting a Zoom Mom's group for women with kids in elementary through high school. If you are a mom of that age child and didn't receive an invitation, I goofed! Please let me know.
