
Amazing

Welcome to September 2020! It is an amazing time to be alive, isn't it? Debt Pay-Off Campaign Update

More Good News---FPC loan balance currently stands at \$69,560. The Debt Pay-Off account now contains \$29,494 which will pay the monthly payments for September thru December 2020. We will still need about \$40,000 to fully pay-off the loan.

Please continue with your contributions. If you plan to make a significant end of year payment, please consider making it sooner rather than later. And if we can pay-off the remaining debt in early 2021 we can save the church another \$1,000 to \$1,500, in interest expense.

Returned pledge cards will be kept under lock and key in the office until the Finance Secretary, Eric Van Sky, records the information. The Stewardship Committee will keep the congregation and Session informed on the Campaign's progress/results.

A member of the Finance Committee will discuss the estimated 2021 budget during the September 27th church service.

Children's Ministry



If you read my newsletter article last month, you might remember that I said I was polling all our PreK – Elementary families to find out how they felt about conducting Children's programming online vs. conducting it in person this

fall. As you might imagine, people have a lot of opinions and preferences on this subject and most of them feel pretty strongly. My dream is always to make everyone happy. How many times do you think my dream has come true? Someday I will be more realistic. Maybe.

Realizing I couldn't make everyone happy, and that the top priority needs to be keeping our families safe and feeling cared for, I prepared several options for the Christian Education committee to consider at our August meeting. It was one of our longest meetings, during the almost 6 years I have been on staff, and I appreciate their thoughtful consideration of possibilities. It was decided to start Sunday School first, and do it over Zoom.

If conditions are right, and session approves it, our best-case scenario is to begin WOW in person, as early as October. I have been soliciting volunteers to help with cooking, table parenting and programming. It will need to look much different than our usual buffet service, with 7 or 8 to a dinner table and kids sitting elbow to elbow in classrooms. We want to do it safely and well, when we can meet again, and we are strategizing and preparing. If you have never volunteered with WOW, but would consider helping with meal prep or cleanup or if you would be willing to be a shepherd to a group of kids, please let me know. At this time, the following people have agreed to help in some capacity: Kitchen Duty – Mike

Tabler, Nancy Shultz, Cathy Talmadge, Carolyn Hess, George Sayles and Jean Jacobson; Table Parents – Megan Warren, Megan Highbargin, Kristen Krom, Pastor Mike, Sue Tabler and myself.

For the families of our youngest kiddos, we have been figuring out how we might be able to open the Nursery during Worship. We have been reading CDC recommendations and have been in discussion with our lovely Nursery staff on what rules and guidelines need to be put in place to be able to open safely. We have a plan and it is going to session to see if it is acceptable or if it still needs some work. I hope we will have an opening date very soon.

Meanwhile, I plan to begin leading Sunday School over Zoom from 9:15 to 9:45 AM on Sunday mornings, beginning September 20th. I am putting together my lessons and will be distributing supply packets to families who register to participate. I will lead lessons from a PCUSA Story Bible called *Growing in God's Love*. We will open with prayer and include opportunities for children to read aloud, discuss and to do arts and crafts related to the story. We will end each session with a game. I've learned a few things through Spring Sunday School over Zoom and our WOW Summer Camp that I hope will help me to make this class engaging and very interactive.

We (CE) are doing our best to be flexible and helpful and to adapt to changes that staying safe in a Pandemic require. While not wanting to give up on the importance of Christian Education in the life of children and youth. It's hard isn't it! Personally, sometimes I succeed and sometimes I flop in the adaptations I make. I personally appreciate all the grace you have shown me. And the ways you have been helpful. Thank you!
