## Growing Pains

*Beloved, we are God's children now; what we will be has not yet been revealed. What we do know is this: when he is revealed, we will be like him, for we will see him as he is. (1 John 3:2)*

As we enter the seventh, yes, I said the seventh month of life in times of COVID, it is more apparent than ever how ill prepared the world was to deal with this crisis and even more apparent how difficult it is to recover and try to find our new normal. I, for one, am getting tired. Are you? So how do we move forward? Or as the Apostle John would remind us, "Beloved, we are God's children now: what we will be has not yet been revealed."

John meant these words as words of hope for his audience. They are words of hope because they remind us that no matter what has happened up to this point, we were and are and always will be God's beloved children. I think that is something that we need to remember as we go forward in uncharted territory, not with fear but with audacious hope in the future God is calling us into.

Now for the bad news. Change and growth come at a price. And they are not always smooth and painless. Growing pains are a very real thing. Even and especially for us as a congregation. As I sit here and think back on our journey over the past months that is very apparent to me.

As we entered shut-down in March, we had many growing pains indeed. How to continue to worship as a congregation even as we were physically apart. How to stay in connected. How to keep communication open. How to stay aware of our needs and support each other. Our growing pains over these months have been painful at times.

I would like to tell you that we transitioned into the COVID world smoothly and efficiently and with grace, but that would not be the complete truth. We made mistakes. We took missteps. We fumbled and had some not so graceful moments. And yet, we have, by God's grace, carried on and moved forward. These months have made it very clear where our weaknesses are and how hard it is to learn to be a congregation in new ways. And we are learning and growing. My prayer is that you remember that it is God's grace and mercy and forgiveness that has made us what we are and the sharing of that mercy and grace and forgiveness that will allow us to become what God has in store for us.



Now we enter a new phase of congregational life where we more fully come back together face to face. As we restart our church programs and activities as safely and as faithfully as we can, my hope in Christ is that you will hold your church leaders and fellow congregants in prayer as we go through our next phase of growing pains.

Indeed, we do not know what the future has in store for our beloved church, but the Good News is that whatever it is, as Christ is more fully revealed in us, it will be beautiful indeed.

## 2021 STEWARDSHIP CAMPAIGN IS ONGOING

The 2021 Stewardship Campaign is here. Due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic we are conducting the campaign primarily by mail, email and Newsletter.

The Campaign letter was mailed to the congregation on September 22<sup>nd</sup>. The letter includes an estimate of the 2021 operating budget. Also included with the letter will be a pledge card and a self addressed stamped return envelope. The letter requests that the completed pledge card be mailed back to the office---or dropped off at the office NLT the last week in October.

Returned pledge cards will be kept under lock and key in the office until the Finance Secretary, Eric Van Sky, records the information. The Stewardship Committee will keep the congregation and Session informed on the Campaign's progress/results.

A member of the Finance Committee discussed the estimated 2021 budget during the September 27<sup>th</sup> church service.

## DEBT PAY-OFF CAMPAIGN UPDATE

As of September 22, 2020

More Good News---FPC loan balance currently stands at \$63,409. The Debt Pay-Off account now contains \$24,648 which will pay the monthly payments for October thru January 2021. We will still need about \$35,000 to fully pay-off the loan.

Please continue with your contributions. If you plan to make a significant end of year payment, please consider making it sooner rather than later. And if we can pay-off the remaining debt in early 2021 we can save the church another \$1,000 to \$1,500, in interest expense.

I'm not big on Halloween, but I love kids and their excitement about the holiday. I love showing off the friendly and caring people of our church, and the building itself.

Of course this year, we can't possibly invite the city of Bellevue into our building. But members of Christian Education and some from Membership committee were talking and we came up with an alternative.

On October 21<sup>st</sup> from 5:30 to 6:30 PM, we plan to host a Trunk or Treat out in the Welcome School side of the parking lot. We are looking for congregation members who will bring their car between 4:45 and 5:15. We will park them 6 feet apart, in a horseshoe shape. We will invite the families of children of our congregation and Welcome School to park in the upper parking lot and walk their kids down to trick or treat from car to car. Please bring wrapped candy or treats such as fruit snacks or pencils or trinkets, and your mask. We can provide gloves, trays and tongs to help you pass things out safely. You can decorate your trunk or not, wear a costume or not, as you prefer. If you'd rather set up a table outside, we can make that happen too. Normally, we put the word out in the community too, but with the lack of Halloween opportunities this year, we are afraid we might be swarmed and not able to control the crowd and keep everyone safe. Next year we will invite the community in again, but for this year, please help us keep it to our congregation and Welcome School.

We do have a snow date reserved, of October 28<sup>th</sup>, but that's only if snow covers the parking lot on the 21<sup>st</sup>. If it's just cold, we'll just bundle up and still host it on the 21<sup>st</sup>.
