

On the first day of the week, very early in the morning, the women took the spices they had prepared and went to the tomb. PER CAPITA - PER PERSON

The **required** total Per Capita amount due from each congregation is a combined request from the Presbytery of Missouri River Valley, Synod of Lakes and Prairies, and the General Assembly. It is **\$39.68** for each active member, which is a .03 increase from last year. In 2021, our apportionment is **\$10,515.20**. If we don't reach that amount from the Per Capita request, funds will be taken from somewhere else in our budget to ensure First Presbyterian meets the required Per Capita assessment.

Take a special Per Capita envelope from the name tag table. Include a check for **\$39.68** for each church member in your family. Write your envelope # on your check. If you do not have the envelope, please write Per Capita in the memo portion of your check. Leave the envelope or check in the offering plate or mail to the office. Our church paid the full amount of \$10,515.20 in February to the Presbytery. As of March 21st we have collected \$5,739.36, the remaining balance of \$4,776.84 will be taken out of the Operating Budget
