Hospitality

"Be devoted to one another in love. Honor one another above yourselves. Never be lacking in zeal, but keep your spiritual fervor, serving the Lord. Be joyful in hope, patient in affliction, faithful in prayer. Share with the Lord's people who are in need. Practice hospitality." (Romans 12:10-13).

Fred Craddock, tells a story of a church that lost track of the importance of hospitality. Sadly, it was a church he once served, early in his ministry. It was located in the hills of eastern Tennessee.

Years later, Fred returned to that church. He brought his wife, Nettie, along for the ride — for she had never seen it. As the two of them drove to the little town, Fred reminisced about a time of controversy in that church. The nearby Oak Ridge National Laboratory was expanding, and new families were moving into the area. Fred, the young pastor, urged the people of this beautiful, little white-frame church to call on the newcomers, to invite them to join them.

"They wouldn't fit in here," was the curt reply.

A week later, there was a congregational meeting. "I move," said one of the longtime members, "that in order to be a member of this church, you must own property in the county." The motion passed, over the pastor's objections.

When Fred and Nettie pulled up to the old church building, years later, it looked to be a busy place, much busier than he remembered. In his words:

"The parking lot was full — motorcycles and trucks and cars packed in there. And out front, a great big sign: 'Barbecue, all you can eat.' It's a restaurant, so we went inside. The pews are against a wall. They have electric lights now, and the organ pushed over into the corner. There are all these aluminum and plastic tables, and people sitting there eating barbecued pork and chicken and ribs — all kinds of people. Parthians and Medes and Edomites and dwellers of Mesopotamia, all kinds of people. I said to Nettie, 'It's a good thing this is not still a church, otherwise these people couldn't be in here."

Mercifully, our church is not at all like that church. But it does beg the question of just how good our hospitality is? How do visitors and friends to our church see us? Are we welcoming and hospitable? I don't mean just our greeters and hosts. I mean every one of us. Do we go out of our way to make a visitor feel welcome or do we leave that job up to others?

Do we go out of our way to greet and help our visitors get situated and ready for worship or do we use the time before worship to visit with each other? Every opportunity that each of us does not take to welcome a stranger is another reason that they will not return to worship and serve Christ with us.

So how is your hospitality doing these days? Not the Membership Committee, as they are working very hard to make us a more welcoming place for visitors. How is your hospitality, personally?

PER CAPITA - PER PERSON

The **required** total Per Capita amount due from each congregation is a combined request from the Presbytery of Missouri River Valley, Synod of Lakes and Prairies, and the General Assembly. It is \$39.68 for each active member, which is a .03 increase from last year. In 2021, our apportionment is \$10,515.20. If we don't reach that amount from the Per Capita request, funds will be taken from somewhere else in our budget to ensure First Presbyterian meets the required Per Capita assessment.

Take a special Per Capita envelope from the name tag table. Include a check for \$39.68 for each church member in your family. Write your envelope # on your check. If you do not have the envelope, please write Per Capita in the memo portion of your check. Leave the envelope or check in the offering plate or mail to the office. Our church paid the full amount of \$10,515.20 in February to the Presbytery. As of April 25th we have collected \$6.555.40, the remaining balance of \$3,959.80 will be taken out of the Operating Budget

Contingency Fund

The CONTINGENCY FUND has been established to fund emergency repairs and replacements such as the HVAC. This fund currently has \$15,457. The goal is to build the Contingency Fund to at least \$75,000.

Prayerfully consider contributing, above and beyond your donations to the operating budget, to the CONTINGNCY FUND so we can achieve this important goal soon.

The ingredients are being provided by First Presbyterian Mission Committee.

#2 It's been lovely doing evening zooms with moms and with women of all ages in our congregation in recent months. The current women's zoom runs through May 12th. Then we are going to take a break until it gets good and cold again in the fall. Maybe October or November. Many of us have gotten sick of Zoom meetings but I hope by the fall it will be a treat again. Thanks to all who have participated!

#3 I just sent off our latest check to Presbyterian Mission Giving Catalog. With \$350 of children's Sunday school and WOW offering, we were able to donate: 2 refugee food baskets, 2 piglets, 1 Arts Education gift for Young People of Color and 3 tree sapling sets. These are items the kids picked out that they wanted to work towards donating. Great job, kids! We just love helping people all around the world, help themselves and others! I bet there are others of you in our congregation who would enjoy perusing the catalog and choosing something to gift. The mission giving catalogs are just outside the church office. Prices range from just a few dollars to hundreds of dollars. Something for everyone.

#4 I am considering hosting God & The Girls #3, an intergenerational women's retreat on Saturday, August 14th from 9 AM to Noon. Our theme will be WONDER & AWE. The date and day of week is still flexible. If you are interested in participating, or if you'd like to participate AND help, please email me at lkreffert@aol.com or talk to me in person.

Sunday School ends on Sunday, May 16th. It's been a good year and I have really enjoyed the kids and I have been thankful for Zoom. But I have to confess that I really look forward to meeting in person in the fall and having our other teachers back! And I know the kids look forward to that, also.

VBS registration will open on May 1st at myvbs.org/ bellevuefpc. That's coming up! I predict the 3 and 4 year old class will fill very fast. And I need to hold the line on keeping that class small. So, if you have a 3 or 4 year old you are hoping to have participate in VBS, I'd recommend you plan to register that first week in May. I have a little more flexibility in groupings for older kids, but registering early is still the safest. VBS runs 9 AM to noon, Monday through Friday, July 19th through 23rd. Ages 3 (and potty trained) through completed 6th grade are invited to participate. Cost is \$10 per child, which includes a tshirt and the music cd. What a bargain! There is family max of \$30 and scholarships are available. There will be a volunteer registration open that day too at the same site. I have a great start to the crew of volunteers we need, but registering allows you to tell me what size tshirt you prefer and exactly where you do or do not want to work. Youth ages completed 7th grade and up are welcome, as well as adults, of course. Youth volunteers get their tshirt for free. Adult volunteers are encouraged to donate the \$7 tshirt cost.

The 6th graders that you see recognized earlier in the newsletter have all been active in Sunday School and/ or WOW. We couldn't host a WOW graduation this year because of Covid, but we wanted to recognize these special young people as they transition from our children's to our youth program.
