Contributions received after December 31st December 31 cannot be back dated.

"So God created man in His own image, in the image of God He created him; male and female He created them." Genesis 1:27

Our study this fall is based on Bob Goff's book "Everybody Always" so we've been talking about loving our neighbors, who our neighbors are and also about loving all people at all times, not just when someone is or isn't looking. Paul and Peter had a discussion about this over 2000 years ago and it's still an ongoing thing in all of our lives. In Galatians 2:11-21 Paul is reprimanding Peter for being friends with the Gentiles and eating dinner with them but only when the Jerusalem Christians weren't looking. Gentile Christians came from a different tradition and background than Jewish Christians and there was a disagreement on whether they had to follow the Jewish tradition to be a Christian. Peter had started welcoming all Christians of all backgrounds until someone else was watching. I think we all still encounter this in our lives, people of different faiths, educational backgrounds, economic backgrounds, ethnicities and some people are still hung up on the

us versus them mentality. People are focusing more on differences instead of similarities and I think as Christians it's a good reminder in the above scripture, we are all created in



the image of God therefore we are all part of the family of God, beautifully, wonderfully and uniquely created. We are called to love God, how can we not love those He made in His image?
