#### **A Different Road**

"In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, asking, "Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? For we observed his star at its rising, and have come to pay him homage."" Matthew 2:1-2


You are all familiar with the Christmas song "The Twelve Days of Christmas," right? The song that never seems to end. Believe it or not, there should be one more verse. The thirteenth and the best day of Christmas is left out. Why is it the best day? Because it is the Feast of the Epiphany. January 6<sup>th</sup>. The day that we remember the wise men who followed the star and came to see the new thing that God was doing. For the church, Epiphany is a season that begins on January 6 and runs until Lent starts.

Epiphany comes from two Greek words epi and phaino. Combined, the two words mean "to show forth" or "appear." During the season of Epiphany, the focus and purpose of the Scriptures we read in worship are chosen to "show forth" or make known to the world that Jesus is Immanuel, "God with us." The season of Epiphany helps us see who Jesus is and to understand what he has done for us. That will be the focus of the Lent and Easter seasons which follow Epiphany. So if you have ever wondered why we go from Jesus' birth to his death in just a few short months, now you know!

In the Christmas story, the wise men represent "the world," the outsiders who follow the star and take great joy at finding, at long last, Jesus. Later, they will avoid King Herod and travel home by a different road to avoid him and his evil plot against Jesus.

Just like the wise men, the season of Epiphany is a reminder to us that we are called to do the same. To travel by a different road. As we discover more and more deeply who is this Jesus, God made real for us, then we can't help but travel through our lives in new and different ways.

Now that the craziness of the Christmas season is over and a brand new year has begun, what new ways is God inviting you to live out your faith? In what new ways can you let those in your life know how your life in Christ is transforming you? What new roads are you called to walk as you "show forth" the joy of God with us? New year. New life. New journey with Christ. May this New Year find your life filled with the glory of Christ lived out in new ways of loving and serving God's children.

#### PER CAPITA - PER PERSON

Per Capita is a set amount of money (apportionment) per member that congregations pay to the larger Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). It is a Presbyterian Covenant Community Fund - part of the glue that holds Presbyterians together. Because every Presbyterian shares in the benefit of the PC(USA)'s system of government, the expenses associated with coordinating and performing the functions of that system should be shared by everyone as well. The Per Capita amount per individual member in 2022 is \$39.68. All members are invited to contribute Per Capita as an additional amount above and beyond the estimate of giving for the annual Stewardship Campaign.

The **required** total per capita amount due from each congregation is a combined request from the Presbytery of Missouri River Valley, Synod of Lakes and Prairies, and the General Assembly. We will owe \$39.68 for each active member. In 2022, our apportionment will be \$10,118.40. We were \$4,000.00 short in 2021 so the remaining amount came from the General Fund which contributed to the negative balance last year. If we don't reach that amount from the per capita request this year the funds will again be taken from somewhere else in our budget to ensure First Presbyterian meets the required per capita assessment.

#### **Next Steps**

Please take a special per capita envelope from the name tag table. Include a check for \$39.68 for each church member in your family and extra if you can for shut-ins and confirmands who are unable to pay. Write your envelope # on your check. If you do not have the envelope, please write Per Capita in the memo portion of your check. Leave the envelope or check in the offering plate or the office by February 14th. Our church must pay our total per capita amount by February 15, 2022.

# Small Gift, Big Impact

This comes to us from the Presbyterian Agency – As Presbyterians, we are a people rooted in the grace of Jesus Christ. Generous gifts to the Presbyterian Giving Catalog are signs of our gratitude: feeding the hungry, comforting the brokenhearted and sharing our faith with young and old. By joining our gifts together, however large or small, we expand our witness to God's gracious and abundant work in the world.

As of December 20<sup>th</sup>, our church family has contributed \$3,337.00 to the Giving Catalog project.
