#### Mercy

"And as he sat at dinner in the house, many tax collectors and sinners came and were sitting with him and his disciples. When the Pharisees saw this, they said to his disciples, "Why does your teacher eat with tax collectors and sinners?" But when he heard this, he said, "Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick. Go and learn what this means, 'I desire mercy, not sacrifice.' For I have come to call not the righteous but sinners."" Matthew 9:10-13

In Shakespeare's play, "The Merchant of Venice," Portia says to Shylock:

The quality of mercy is not strain'd, It droppeth as the gentle rain from heaven Upon the place beneath. It is twice blest: It blesseth him that gives and him that takes.

Portia makes a couple of important observations about mercy. First, that it is not mercy if it is "strain'd," that is, forced instead of freely given. Second, that in showing mercy, both the giver and the receiver find blessing. I think that maybe good old Willie is on to something here, don't you?

This season of Lent, the buzzword for us is mercy. Mercy is one of the things at the very heart of God. It is an integral part of who He is. God is mercy and God shows mercy to us. Not out of obligation. Not out of necessity but out of His great love for us. To show mercy to us is just what God does. And God shows us mercy over and over again. Why? Well because that is what we need. Mercy. Because we can never seem to perfectly live up to who God has created us to be. Because without mercy we cannot live.

We've all fallen short of the glory of God and have gotten caught up in seeking ways of living that are not satisfying. Or life-giving. Try as we might, all of our efforts fall short. We've bought into the old way of living -- chasing the desires of the flesh and senses (as the Apostle Paul so often reminds us in his letters) -- and have found them lacking. There's a better way, and we don't have to purchase it. Or earn it. Or deserve it. In fact, it isn't for sale. It's a gift we've already received. To get the life we want from it, we need to live into it.

In Christ, however, we're being mercy and graced to life by our loving God. So there it is for you. In plain English. Mercied and graced to life in that never ending, life giving, gentle rain from Heaven. That is what Lent is all about. Remembering why we so desperately need mercy and never forgetting that mercy is God's middle name. And it comes at no cost to us. But there is one little stipulation. To fully enjoy God's mercy we need to pass the gift on. To be merciful to ourselves and to each other. Only when we pass on God's mercy to others can we truly understand what mercy means.

So journey along with me this Lent as we rediscover our God who is mercy.




#### **Ash Wednesday**

Over 40 years ago, the earthen dam of a nuclear waste disposal pond broke near Church Rock and dumped tons of solid, radioactive waste and 90 million gallons of acidic and radioactive liquids into the Rio Puerco. The resulting contamination of the land, air and ground water affected nine Navajo municipalities.

The toxic and cumulative effects of this human-caused disaster have impacted the Navajo people for generations — especially in the form of such chronic health problems as asthma as well as a higher incidence of miscarriages, birth defects, and liver and pancreatic cancer.

One Great Hour of Sharing connects us with these families through MASE, the Multicultural Alliance for a Safe Environment. MASE's mission envisions respectful, peaceful communities cherishing a healthy environment.

I like to think that's a lot like our Church's mission, too. It is part of what led the Committee on the Self-Development of People to connect with MASE, reaching out "like the arms of the Church," as the Rev. Dr. Alonzo Johnson with SDOP puts it, to address the systems and structures that perpetuate oppression, leading to poverty.

Susan Gordon, MASE's coordinator, reminds us that "this is not short-term work. This is decades. And generations. Taking the long view has not prevented progress; the community took a very strong stand opposing new uranium mines on Navajo Nation and were instrumental in getting Navajo Nation to pass two fundamental laws. One prohibits new uranium mining and another prohibits the transportation of radioactive materials across the nation."

Let us pray: Thank you, God for connecting us. Thank you for neighbors, each with needs and gifts to share, and for our church, the whole Church, together, and for Jesus Christ, Amen.

#### PER CAPITA - PER PERSON

The **required** total per capita amount due from each congregation is a combined request from the Presbytery of Missouri River Valley, Synod of Lakes and Prairies, and the General Assembly. We will owe \$39.68 for each active member. In 2022, our apportionment will be \$10,118.40. We were \$4,000.00 short in 2021 so the remaining amount came from the General Fund which contributed to the negative balance last year. If we don't reach that amount from the per capita request this year the funds will again be taken from somewhere else in our budget to ensure First Presbyterian meets the required per capita assessment.

#### **Next Steps**

Please take a special per capita envelope from the name tag table. Include a check for \$39.68 for each church member in your family and extra if you can for shut-ins and confirmands who are unable to pay. Write your envelope # on your check. If you do not have the envelope, please write Per Capita in the memo portion of your check. Leave the envelope or check in the offering plate or the office. Our church paid our total per capita amount in February.
