

Acts of Loving Kindness

What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if someone claims to have faith but has no deeds? Can such faith save them? Suppose a brother or a sister is without clothes and daily food. If one of you says to them, "Go in peace; keep warm and well fed," but does nothing about their physical needs, what good is it? In the same way, faith by itself, if it is not accompanied by action, is dead (James 2:14-17).



This passage from the Book of James is at the heart of what doing mission is all about. Mission is something we actively engage in and not just think about. Below are several opportunities to engage in mission that Denise Seaman has compiled for us:

End of Year Contributions


To comply with IRS regulations, all contributions intended for the current year tax statement must be dated in the current year. These contributions should be turned in as early as possible and at least by the last day of the year. The financial record for the current year will be closed out on the last day of the current year. Contributions received after December 31st will be entered in the next year's record and will appear on the next year's statement. Contributions received after December 31 cannot be back dated.

PER CAPITA - PER PERSON

The **required** total per capita amount due from each congregation is a combined request from the Presbytery of Missouri River Valley, Synod of Lakes and Prairies, and the General Assembly. We will owe \$40.85 for each active member. In 2023, our apportionment will be \$9,967.40. If we don't reach that amount from the per capita request, funds will be taken from somewhere else in our budget to ensure First Presbyterian meets the required per capita assessment. **As of January 19th,** we have \$2,967.70, so a long way to go.

Next Steps

Take a special per capita envelope from the name tag table. Include a check for \$40.85 for each church member in your family. Write your envelope # on your check. If you do not have the envelope, please write Per Capita in the memo portion of your check. Leave the envelope or check in the offering plate or the office by **February 9th**. If you would like to prepay your Per Capita for next year just go ahead and place your envelope in the offering plate by January 31, 2023. Our church must pay our total per capita amount by **February 15, 2023**.

Children's Ministry



January was a quiet month for children's ministry, we restarted all our programs the second week and it was so wonderful to be back in the swing of things. The snow cancelled one of our WOW meetings, but I know that all the kids enjoyed having the Megan Highbargin | day off from school, even

though the snow totals were disappointing. In Sunday School we have been studying Jesus' early life. We started the month in Matthew talking about how Joseph had to move his family to Egypt to keep Jesus safe, moved into the story of Jesus' baptism by John the Baptist, and talked about how the news of Jesus began to spread to the people and how we too can share this news. In the book of John, we learned about the symbolism of Jesus being the Lamb and of when Peter and Andrew first met him. The children are so insightful during their bible time and I love hearing the ideas and thoughts that they share.

In WOW we continued our study in the Beatitudes and had a wonderful lesson on Matthew 5:5 "God blesses those who are humble (meek), for they will inherit the whole earth." The children acted out scenes to show the difference between having humility verses being boastful and discussed ways that we can serve others. We ended this lesson with a discussion of the phrase "having to eat humble pie" and learned that there are times when we need to apologize for our actions, but that loving God produces fruit in



our lives, and to remind us of this and we made fruit of the spirit pies. These were a little messy, but delicious and a great way to remind us to be more like Jesus. In the last weeks of January, we will continue to study Matthew 5:6 and Matthew 5:7, to learn what else Jesus can teach us about how to live our
