Where to From Here?

Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia! Now what do we do? Our Lenten Journey is almost over. We have yet to travel to the upper room with Jesus and his disciples. We have yet to hear Jesus say those powerful words that Jesus will say in Matthew's Gospel at the table, "Given and shed for you for the forgiveness of your sins." We have yet to the cross on Good Friday and hear Jesus cry out, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" And we have yet to travel to the empty tomb to hear again from the group of women who will find it empty. We heard once more



the words of the angels at the empty tomb, "He is not here, but has risen." That blessed day of Resurrection is almost here. Yet we know how the story will end. So now what do we do?

So what do we do now as we prepare to go forth from the empty tomb? Let us follow the example of the first witnesses of the empty tomb. After the two angels reminded Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James, and the other women that Jesus had risen, Luke tells us that they remembered the words, and returning from the tomb they told all these things to the eleven and to all the rest. They went forth from the tomb changed by the resurrection of Jesus. They went forth from the tomb to be living witnesses of God's power over sin and death.

So where do we go once we leave the empty tomb? Let us follow the example of Jesus' first disciples. After Jesus appeared to seven of the eleven disciples, they simply went back to their fishing business. They went back to their vocations or stations in life and took the witness of the resurrection with them. They lived in the joy of the resurrection of Jesus while carrying out their daily, ordinary work and play and rest that they followed before Jesus had called them.

And just like those first disciples, we too are called to be every day witnesses to the resurrection of Jesus. We believe and are baptized. We have the hope of eternal life. We have the joy of the resurrection living inside of us. And like the women at the empty tomb and the eleven disciples, we have jobs and roles and stations in life that God has given to us as gift. Like those seven fishermen, we all have one or more callings in life: father, husband, mother, wife, son, daughter, brother, sister, grandparent, employee, retiree, friend, and neighbor. Each of these callings comes with a set of duties and responsibilities. As followers of the Risen Christ, by God's grace, we are called to go about our daily duties and responsibilities, to pursue our vocations with the joy, love and peace we have received through the forgiveness of Christ. And, more than likely, others will take notice and God will bless our faithful work by giving us opportunities to tell the Good News to everyone we encounter as we go about our daily living.

So where do we go from here? We go forth from Easter Sunday and the celebration of the empty tomb to live freely as God's blessed children forgiven in Christ. We go forth empowered by God's Spirit living and active within us to live in the joy of the resurrection to be every day witnesses of God's love in Jesus Christ. We go forth to share the Good News of wholeness in Christ with our hurting and broken world. So go forth boldly, filled with the Spirit.

The **required** total per capita amount due from each congregation is a combined request from the Presbytery of Missouri River Valley, Synod of Lakes and Prairies, and the General Assembly. We will owe **\$40.85** for each active member. In 2023, our apportionment will be **\$9,967.40**. If we don't reach that amount from the per capita request, funds will be taken from somewhere else in our budget to ensure First Presbyterian meets the required per capita assessment.

Include a check for **\$40.85** for each church member in your family and extra if you can for shut-ins and confirmands who are unable to pay. Write your envelope # on your check. If you do not have the envelope, please write Per Capita in the memo portion of your check. Leave the envelope or check in the offering plate or the office. Our church paid our total per capita amount in February.


